


persuasive case law questions whether such an unsigned docket entry satisfies the requirement for a final order since it can be changed by the court at any time. See *Carter v. Beverly Hills Savings and Loan Ass'n*, 884 F.2d 1186, 1190 (9th Cir. 1989); *Chicago Ass'n. of Commerce & Industry v. Thomas* 1987 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 11722 (IL. 1987).

Thus, Plaintiffs request that an order be issued that clearly satisfies the requirements of Rule 58 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.
